#### **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

## FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

- Vaccination update: DC Moravec reported on recent COVID-19 vaccination efforts that included a mobile booster clinic on November 12<sup>th</sup>, a pediatric vaccination clinic on November 13<sup>th</sup> and a high thru-put booster clinic on November 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>. The high thru-put clinics held were the only high thru-put clinics in Kitsap County during this time person. The next vaccination clinic will be held on December 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>.
- P&P Work Group appointees: Commissioners Carey and von Ibsch volunteered to participate in the P&P Work Group. The group intends to meet prior to the next Board meeting.
- St. Michael's update: Chief Teran reported that two nurse have been hired by St. Michaels specifically to reduce the in-take time for transports. The nurses will be on shift for 11 hours a day, Monday-Saturday.
- Bainbridge Community Foundation Award: Chief Teran announced that Bainbridge Island Fire Department was a recipient of the Outstanding Humanitarian Award from the Bainbridge Community Foundation for "exceptional leadership in the Bainbridge Island COVID-19 vaccination effort."
- Core Values discussion: Chief Teran presented each Commissioner with a challenge coin listing the Department's core values and discussed the importance of the core values in all facets of BIFD's operation.
- Volunteer Academy graduation: Chief Teran announced that the volunteer academy graduation would be held on December 12<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 PM.

• COBI update: Chief Teran announced that COBI has approved and signed the ILA for Fire Safety Services and that BIFD's comments regarding the tree ordinance were passed by the City Council.

- Future Tri-district meeting: Chief Teran noted interest in convening a Tri-District Board meeting in the first quarter of 2022.
